The YMCA was first organized in London in 1844 when George Williams recognized the need for a safe place for young men to escape the hazards on the streets. The first U.S. Y was formed in Boston in 1851. Our Grand Forks YMCA opened on March 26, 1886, through the collaboration of six churches within the community, who each appointed a pastor as a lay member to help establish the YMCA. These volunteers determined that the YMCA should "promote the moral welfare, the social, intellectual, and physical benefit of young men". The first YMCA offered group devotions, singing, prayer, reading rooms and gym. Today, the Altru Family YMCA is open to men, women and children of all faiths, races, abilities, ages and incomes. In 1969, Our current facility was built, which now hosts a state-of-the-art fitness center, group classes, recreation areas and the YMCA Educational Center.
